# from the GARDEN


The plant spotlight for April/May 2016 is Calylophus berlandieri, Berlandier's sundrops.

This Texas native is normally an evergreen here in Austin. It can grow 20 inches tall and 2 feet wide. It prefers full sun to partial shade and needs well-draining soil; it does not

like to have "wet feet." It has a very long bloom time, extending from March to September. Due to our warm temps this winter, it was still blooming in January and February. The bright yellow flowers of calylophus are hard to miss. The 2-inch yellow flowers stand out against the narrow, spiny-toothed green leaves. It is very drought tolerant and, once established, can survive solely on rainfall. It cannot handle being overwatered, and this is normally the cause of death.

Around the Clubhouse, we will start swapping out winter annual color for spring flowers. These include impatiens, petunia, begonia, coleus, and caladiums, just to name a few. Due to the timing of the WGC Tournament, we will be cutting back all of the love grass beds on the course and other ornamental grasses around the Clubhouse at this time of year.





The Club is working toward earning certification by Audubon International In the Audubon Cooperative Sanctuary Program for Golf.

#### **SEAFOOD GARNISH**

#### Inaredients

½ pound jumbo lump crab, chilled

1/2 pound 16/20 size peeled and deveined Gulf shrimp
1/4 cup fresh lime juice
1/4 cup fresh orange juice
1/2 cup minced red onion
1/4 cup fresh cilantro leaves
Salt and pepper to taste

#### **GAZPACHO**

#### Ingredients

28 ounces San Marzano crushed tomatoes

28 ounces tomato juice 8 ounces Roma tomatoes, chopped

3 large celery stalks, chopped 1 cucumber, peeled and chopped 2 cloves garlic, minced

2 cloves garric, mincea ¼ cup fresh basil leaves, chopped

¼ cup virgin olive oil ½ tablespoon red wine vinegar 1 teaspoon Tabasco sauce

1 teaspoon celery salt
Salt and pepper to taste

#### Method

Steam shrimp for 3 minutes and chill. Slice shrimp into 1/4" thick slices and cover with lime and orange juices, onion, cilantro leaves, salt, and pepper. Allow to marinate overnight.

For the soup, combine all Gazpacho ingredients and puree with an immersion blender or food processor. Chill.

To Serve: Fill a 4-ounce ramekin halfway with jumbo lump crab and the top half with drained Shrimp Ceviche. Place ramekin upside down into a chilled soup bowl and then pour Gazpacho around the outside. Lift ramekin carefully. Garnish with fresh cilantro leaves.




